She is now known for her unique craft in Japanese planting called Kokedama (loosely translated to mean "Moss Ball"), and her growing business Handmade By Janelle Slade.

She learnt the skill from her sister and fast grew to love it, perfecting her craft and gaining more knowledge about which different plant groups work and don't work.

Kokedama are the perfect living gift. There is soil that is specially blended around the plant's root system and formed into a ball. Sphagnum moss holds the soil and then Jute twine is meticulously wrapped around making the beautiful ball that you see.

Red Belly Kitchen Boards aims to produce beautiful, functional cutting boards and serving trays that showcase our unique Australian timber species. Each board is made from ethically sourced trees, usually felled for safety reasons. Some comes from our own property, which is compliant with environmental protection guidelines, and selected from 35 years of forest regeneration.

No two Red Belly Kitchen Boards are exactly alike. Each one is individually made over six or seven days involving about 15 processes. Many other kitchen boards can take just minutes to make, some others may take an hour or two. We like to take the extra time to create a work that is totally Australian and reflects a creative kitchen.

All of our boards are hand finished, have convenient finger grips at the ends, and are treated with food grade oil for protection and preservation.

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The Farmer's Plate

THE WAY FOOD SHOULD BE

A passion for fresh, local food (and dreams of a tree change), inspired Kyogle couple Belinda and Steve to embark on one of the biggest adventures of their lives.

Formerly from the Gold Coast, the pair relocated their family of six to a beautiful 100 acre farm at Homeleigh (about 10 minutes from Kyogle) in 2018. There, at Rosewood Farm, they begun harvesting raw honey, farming free-range eggs, and growing their own seasonal produce and making food "the way their grandparents used to make it".

When the opportunity came up to purchase a Kyogle main street cafe near IGA (previously owned by Gateway Fine Foods), Belinda and Steve jumped at the chance. "We love the Northern Rivers and have met many great local farmers and producers that supply world class food," Steve explains. "We love showcasing the best of the region".

The Farmer's Plate is open for breakfast and lunch serving fresh, local food seven days per week. Byron Bay based Zentveld's Coffee is always popular, and Tielka Tea is available to have there or take home.

The Farmer's Plate prides itself on having a range of food to suit all dietary options, including delicious gluten free, dairy free, vegetarian and vegan choices.

You can also pick up Rosewood Farm eggs in store (their hens have more than 20 times the regulated space for 'free range eggs'), and grab raw honey straight from the farm. Rosewood Farm Pork is also availble and there are plans for more local goodies in store soon.

ARTS ARTS



The Roxy Gallery has a new home: upstairs in the Kyogle Memorial Institute. Kyogle Culture looks at the Gallery's rich history, and how this new chapter will help further foster local arts and our community.

Over its 18 year history, the Roxy Gallery in Kyogle has welcomed approximately 72,000 visitors through its doors. As well as introducing locals and tourists to the region's unique creative viewpoints, the gallery aims to foster creative talent, open up opportunities for emerging and professional artists to gain exposure and sales for their works. It also gives artists the chance to develop their profiles in the art world, with many using the Roxy experience as a springboard to other avenues in the professional art world.

A joint initiative of Kyogle and District Arts Inc. and the Kyogle Council, the Roxy has held over 240 exhibitions supporting both local and regional artists, as well as community and school groups, since its official opening on the 9th of September 1996 at the Roxy Commercial Centre (now known as the Christian Life Church). Art was shown in this space until 1998, when it relocated to the former premises on Summerland Way.

The new gallery space, above the Kyogle Memorial Institute (with entry next to Gateway Office Supplies on Summerland Way) has been created as part of the KMI Revitalisation Project which aims to bring 'stage' and 'gallery ' together to create an enhanced arts and culture venue.

As part of the \$640,000 project, the KMI's original entrance from the main street has been reinstated. A number of small display spaces will be activated in the main entrance foyer, including plans for a 'young and emerging artists' space, and a lift has been installed to raise visitors up into the new-look gallery space on the first floor. The new space is a work in progress, but the change in location will provide other opportunities such as small workshops, artist's talks, and a place for

community interaction. In the future, the veranda area will also provide a great place to meet and watch the town life hum along.

The new operating hours for the gallery will be Wednesday to Saturday from 10am to 3pm, with the possibility of including Sunday, once the show gets up and running.

Director Ruth Tsitimbinis explains that a big part of the Gallery's success lies in the commitment and passion of the people behind it. "The volunteers that have supported the Roxy Gallery over the eighteen years are amazing," she smiles. "The majority of volunteers have an affiliation with the Kyogle and District Arts Group (some have been volunteering for 18 years), others are practicing artists, and some people just want to give back to the community. They find it a great way to meet new folk and get involved in the town and region."

The official opening of the new space

will be held in early March, with the first exhibition paying tribute to those that have paved the way. "From the 6th of March we will show 'A Collection of a Selection'," Ruth says. "It will encompass works by people who have had a long standing relationship with the Roxy Gallery as artists, exhibitors, volunteers, supporters of the creative cultures in our region; looking back and giving thanks as we move forward."

While Ruth describes the new space as a "work in progress" she is excited by the new opportunities and experiences emerging as it takes shape. "All worthwhile creative endeavours take time," she laughs. "We have a fresh canvas here and I am looking forward to seeing the community add plenty of colour and life to it."

Cloud Tales

Cloud Tales is the creative offering of first time children's author and illustrator Ilka Nelson. From her off-grid, forest cabin in Collins Creek, Ilka let Kyogle Culture in on her inspiration and writing process.

KCM: What inspired you to write Cloud Tales?

I moved back to this region specifically for the high rainfall (I love water) and the biodiversity. All the creatures and trees and creeks and mountains, they all contribute to my learning and I could say they coauthored this book with me.

Cloud Tales was created to be a beautiful treasure for people to hold and enjoy over their lifetime. It tells the tale of Cloud, a character who is called to Earth by the Trees to help bring back the way of water. One reader compared *Cloud Tales* to *The Little Prince*, it is similar in being a philosophical tale very suited for adults. Children can also experience the tale through the 12 handpainted drawings of Cloud and grow up with the book.

My work connects culture and nature through mythology. Like many, I am devastated by the environmental decay of our world and am always searching how to best help on scale. I have a Masters in storytelling and have studied Water Diplomacy with the UN Institute for Training and Research; Cloud Tales is my first offering that begins to pull it all together.

KCM: What did you learn from the process of self publishing?

It's strange to be on the other side of having the books printed and look back and realise, 'Wow, I did all of that myself'. I learnt the usual lessons about setting longer




timeframes with contractors, but the rest was easy because I've found what I love and it's such a joy. A good approach for me is to let creativity lead; so I set time and space for drawing and writing, and then I support this with good self-discipline and routine.

KCM: Are there plans for more adventures with Cloud and her friends?

Yes! This is only volume one, so watch this space (or sign up to Cloud's newsletter via my website) if you would like to see the journey continue.

KCM: What makes this area home to you and what do you love about it?

I was born and bred in Kyogle. My father, Greg, and my uncles established Daleys Nursery almost 40 years ago. I liken the area to a kind of bio-cultural Eco-tone — a bridge between different world views. Kyogle is a kind of bridge between the super rural world further west and the alternative subculture towards the coast. The line is blurry between farmers, conservationists, alternative folk and creatives, and there are people in Kyogle who embody all of this and more. There is a down-to-earth feel out here that I find refreshing, it's less pretentious and more grounded.

KCM: What got you into photography and filming and why do you choose to specialise in capturing the natural world?

I've been into photography since I was 16 years old. It started out as a curious way to connect with nature, and with the guidance of a creative mentor, I was able to exhibit some of my work in regional galleries. A major highlight was having my conservation photography curated in an outdoor

exhibition in London for the Sumatran Orangutan Society, who have funded the planting of 1.6 million rainforest trees.

With my camera as a tool for creative expression I began to explore the world of film and how videography can plant seeds of awareness and earth connection.

KCM: You have managed to combine all of your passions in to your work. Tell us a bit about 'a lush forest MEDIA'.

a lush forest MEDIA is an emerging platform for my creative offerings; digital story-telling, videography and photography. I create micro-films that communicate the essence of a place, service, project or event and I produce everything from music clips to educational videos and festival promos.

My other focus is annual Transformational Travel & Forest Expeditions to Borneo and Sumatra — and soon will be my first local 'Rainforest Ride' through the Border Ranges National Park. If all goes well this will become an annual affair.

The vision is to create regenerative ecotourism with a focus on tree planting, skill

exchange, ecosystem restoration, ongoing cross-cultural relationship building and connection to place. Kyogle is known as the Gateway to the Rainforest — the potential for regenerative eco-tourism in this region is beyond exciting There are so many opportunities for this here; mountain biking, bio-cultural tours, forest expeditions. The late Malcolm Wallis was an absolute visionary in this regard. If I was a traveller passing through looking for an authentic adventure — I'd jump at the chance to being guided into our World Heritage listed National Parks, managed by the local Githabul rangers and home to the largest expanse of sub-tropical rainforest in Australia. Explore this majestic place on a mountain bike? Yes please!

KCM: Can you tell us your favourite spot to be in nature, locally and around the world?

My favourite spot around Kyogle is without a doubt Brindle Creek up in the heart of the Border Ranges National Park. Ancient Antartic Beech, giant Red Cedars, epic



bird life and pure mountain spring water bubbling up through the forest — just another day in paradise!

My favourite place globally would have to be the Leuser Ecosystem in North Sumatra—it's one of the last major rainforest swathes left in South-East Asia, and the last place on Earth where orangutan, tiger, elephant and rhino co-exist in the wild. On my 2018 expedition we were lucky enough to see a herd of wild elephants and a rafflesia flower in full bloom (the worlds largest flower).


